

YOU CAN GET CITY CERTIFICATES AT CONVENIENCE STORES WITH YOUR 'MY NUMBER' CARD

From January 15 (Tue) and after, you will be able to obtain your Juminhyo (resident certificate), kazei shomeisho (certificate of taxation), nozei shomeisho (certificate of tax payment) and inkan shomei (certificate of personal seal) at any convenience store in Japan any day from 6:30 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. with your 'MY NUMBER' card. As you know, these certificates are required for immigration procedures. Now you don't have to take a day off to visit the city office to get them.

This is a huge convenience for everyone!

GET READY FOR HEAVY SNOWFALL

In Kanto, we have snow mainly in January and February. Last year more than 10 centimeters of snow settled in Iruma on January 22, that caused lots of damages including collision accidents and falls of pedestrians due to slippery conditions and injuries while clearing snow.

To avoid snow damage, it is important to get ready before it starts to snow. Change summer tires to winter tires at the beginning of winter. Refrain from going outside on a heavy snow. If you need to walk on a snowy day, wear snow boots or ice grippers on your shoes. Shorten your stride. Look out for snow sliding from roofs. Roads are icy especially on the bridges. Allow enough time because there can be major delay of transportation. Have a safe and happy winter!

READY FOR FINAL TAX RETURN FILLING WHICH STARTING NEXT MONTH

All employees in Japan received a 'proof of withholding tax' (源泉徵 収票'gensen choshu hyo') document this month. This thin, post-card sized document includes practically all information about your income and taxes based on the a form for year-end adjustment (年末 調整'nenmatsu chosei') you submitted to your company last month. However, some workers miss the adjustment, probably because they work part-time, work for a company that does not take care of the adjustment, or they quit their job in the middle of the year. If you think you missed the adjustment, or if you have any other tax deductions such as a large amount of medical expenses and housing loan, you should file your final tax return (確定申告'kakutei shinkoku'). You can submit your final tax return form at the City Office from the middle of month of February to March 15 (Fri).

Please be advised that as for overseas dependents for tax exemption, you need documents to prove family relationship (e.g. birth certificates) with a Japanese translation and a document to prove remittance with names of the remitter and the receiver and the amount and date of remittance. You also need 'MY NUMBER' to file the tax return. The Information Desk is happy to help your process.

HOW ABOUT GROWING VEGETABLES FROM YOUR COUNTRY AT A CITIZEN'S FARM?

Apply by sending an ofuku hagaki (reply-paid post card) to the Nogyo Shinko-ka in the City Office (postal code: 358-8511, Iruma City Office {this address is sufficient}) between January 4 and 21. Please specify which farm you want (Nakagami or Seibu), your address, name, telephone number and if you are currently using a lot, write the lot number. If the number of applications exceeds the number of lots available, users will be selected by lottery. An application guide is available on and after January 4 at the City Office and on the City's Website.
