PLEASE COOPERATE FOR THE POPULATION CENSUS




The National Government will conduct a population census starting on October 1, 2020. The aim of this once-every-five -years census is to record information on the number of people living in Japan, including foreign residents who have lived or intend to live in Japan for more than three months. The results will be used only for statistical purposes such as the database for measuring birth rate, disaster prevention, revitalizing local communities and other important issues. The information you provide will never be used for any purpose related to

immigration control, taxation, or police activities.

ONLINE ANSWER STARTS SEPTEMBER 14

You can answer the 16 questions on the internet using your own 'Long-in ID' and 'Access Key,' which are both in "Online Answer User Guide" delivered on and after September 14. You can answer through your computer or smart phone, in Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, Tiếngviệt, Português or Español between September 14 and October 7. You can choose to answer on

paper-based census questionnaires and return by postal mail or personally submit it to the census collector between October 1 and 7. If you do not answer by October 7 in either way, the same census collector will visit your house.

Coronavirus Is Still Spreading STAY ALERT!

The situation is still serious that nothing can be said about prospects for early containment of the pandemic. City calls on each citizen to adopt a level-headed response and to keep taking measures to prevent infections from spreading

MAYBE IT'S TIME TO THINK ABOUT HOW TO EVACUATE

Every year, repeatedly, we encounter forces of nature. You may sometimes think "what if this could happen to me?!" Moreover, we are in the midst of this coronavirus pandemic, which forces us to devise ways of evacuation to avoid infection at evacuation centers. So, here are some advice from the Kiki-kanri-ka (Section for Risk Management), Iruma City Office, that you should keep in mind.

What Is the Best for Your Family?

Each citizen should think and prepare what is the most appropriate way of evacuating in your homes. Evacuation does not necessarily mean to move to an evacuation center. If you live in a sturdy building far from a river or a steep slope, it may be better to stay at home with reserves of food and water. Moving to houses of your relatives and friends or staying temporally in your car could also be a good choice, in addition to going to a public evacuation center.

What You Need to Bring to Evacuation Center?

•Mask (or towel)

In consideration of the risk of infection diseases, prepare masks, antiseptic solution and a thermometer. •Blanket

- •Portable radio
- Slipper
- Extra clothes

•Mobile battery

•Shoe bag

•A day's worth of food and water Thermometer
