IRUMA CITY PROMOTES LOCAL CONSUMPTION OF LOCALLY PRODUCED PRODUCTS

Have you heard of the word "Chisan Chisho?" This means to consume locally produced agricultural products, which enables you

to eat a fresh highly nutritious seasonal produce, and helps the environment by reducing time and energy for transportation.

The City prepared a symbol flag of "Iruma-wo Itadakimasu" project to put at sites which deal with local products, such as below. Choose and eat local delicious seasonal products to take advantage of being a citizen of a rural city!

▶ Fureai Asaichi (Morning Market): A morning market held every Saturday at the Shimin Kaikan Hall parking lot from 6:45 a.m. Local farmers sell fresh agricultural products from their farms including seasonal vegetables, as well as potatoes, gobo roots, aroids, mushrooms, eggs and, needless to say, tea leaves. The market is so popular that most of the produce is sold out within an hour of opening.

▶JA Irumano Chokubaijo (Farmer's Market): Located at Koyata 4-6-11 (near the underpass of Ken'odo). Open every day except Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

▶ Miyadera K-Track Market: Located at JA Irumano Miyadera Branch Office. Open every Saturday from 8:30 to 9:00 a.m.

▶ Museum ALIT Asaichi: Open every Sunday at City Museum ALIT, from 8:45 to 9:15 a.m.

▶ Farmer's Market at Fureai Taiju: Located at Kami-Fujisawa 708-1 (near the Kenko Fukushi Center). Open every day from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

HAVE YOU COMPLETED THE YEAR END ADJUSTMENT?



Your income tax is automatically withheld based on the amount of your salary every month by your employer, but the tax amount does not always consider your tax-deductibles. Thus, your employer asks you to give your information for year-end adjustment (nenmatsu chosei). The adjusted tax amount will be added/deducted in your December salary. Submit the forms by deadline, or you may need to file a final tax return by yourself to claim a refund of your overpaid income tax.

Employers usually give you three forms: (1) form for dependent exemption, (2) form for basic/spouse exemptions (image on the left, newly introduced last year) and (3) form for insurance premium exemption. There are other forms, including one for house loan exemption. These are very much complicated forms. The Information Desk for Foreign Residents is happy to help you

complete these forms. Bring the certificates of payments of insurances, or other relevant documents.

CITY BOOKS CLOSED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2020

Iruma City has closed its books for the 2020 fiscal year which ended on March 31, 2021. In the general account, the overall revenue came in at 60,514 million yen, which is a 43.3% increase from the previous year. The expenditure also increased by 44.4% to be 59,233 million yen. These large increases are the results of COVID-19 related subsidies from the National government.

Amounts per capita: ¥150,000 vs. ¥400,000

Municipal taxes contributed 21,218 million yen (35.18% of the total revenue) which equates to about 150,000 yen per capita, while the expenditure per capita was about 400,000 yen. The difference is mostly covered by the subsidies from the National governments and loans.

COVID-19 related expenditures: 17 billion yen

The total that the city expensed for COVID-19 measures in FY2020 was 17,179 million yen, of which 14,843 million was for the subsidy program of 100,000 yen for 147,181 citizens. Other programs exceeding 100 million include the subsidies for child-rearing families and single-parent families and the special shopping coupon program.
