In conjunction with the renewal of the permanent exhibition, a special exhibition is held, focusing on "recycling" and "elementary school children" in olden days. Visit the exhibition to learn what life was like in Iruma when your grandparents and parents were children. There are related events during the period, such as 'bon' dance on January 7 (Sat), children's traditional activities (kite flying,

IT'S ALMOST TIME TO FILE YOUR 2022 FINAL TAX RETURNS

If you can say with confidence "My company has done it for me!" then you are lucky. But some of you may have missed year-end adjustment (年末調整'nenmatsu chosei') for some reasons; probably because you work part-time, work for a company that does not take care of your tax payment, or you



quit your job in the middle of the year. Or you may want to apply for exemptions which your company cannot handle, such as exemptions for housing loan, high-cost medical expenses and overseas dependent.

If you are not sure whether you should file a tax return, please see and check your 'proof of withholding tax' (源泉徴収票'gensen choshu hyo'), which all employees in Japan should have received by this month from your employer.

This small paper includes practically every information about your income and taxes, this can be a proof that your employer has done tax payment for you.

Final tax return for 2022 must be filed by March 15 (Wed). The Information Desk is happy to help you with your processing. Just bring all the related documents, including the gensen choshu hyo, a certificate of life insurance premium payment, receipts of medical expense, etc. Also, if your income is only from your salary or pension, you can submit your completed tax return form at the locations in the table. Because both the special site in the City Office and the Information Desk will be crowded at the end of the filing period, you are advised to get prepared ahead of time.

SUNDAY/HOLIDAY MEDICAL SERVICES

If you or a family member becomes sick or injured on these days, visit a hospital on the list. Healthcare covered by health insurance is provided from 9:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. Please make a call before visiting. These services are basically for patients who do not need to be hospitalized

ARE YOU READY FOR HEAVY SNOW?

In Kanto Area, we have snow mainly in January and February. On January 22, 2017, more than 10 centimeters of snow settled in Iruma, which caused lots of damages including car accidents and falls of pedestrians due to slippery road conditions and injuries while clearing snow.

To avoid damage, it is important

to get ready before the snow. Basically it is the best to refrain from going outside on a heavy snow!

- •Change summer tires to winter tires in December.
- •Add pillars to hold the roof of carport.
- •If you need to walk on a snowy day, wear snow boots or ice grippers on your shoes. Shorten your stride. Look out for snow sliding from roofs. Roads are icy especially on the bridges.
- •Allow enough time because there can be major delay of transportation.
