SPECIAL BENEFIT TO SUPPORT LOW-INCOME HOUSEHOLDS RAISING CHILDREN PAID LAST MONTH

To mitigate the impacts caused by this prices surge, the city paid a special benefit of 50,000 yen per child to low-income families who are raising child(ren) on May 25 (for single parent households) or later (for other households) through a bank transfer. Eligible families include the beneficiaries of single parent allowance (児童扶養手当 Jido Fuyo Teate) and those who received a similar special benefit last year. They should have already received a notice of payment by postal mail; no need to reply.

If You Are Experiencing a Sudden Change in Your Household Finances:



If you have not received this benefit and actually have financial difficulties due to the price surge, you may be able to receive it by applying with necessary documentation. Details of application procedures will be announced in the middle of June. After reviewing eligibility requirements, the same amount will be paid to your bank account. The period for the application will end on February 29, 2024.

 ${\bf Q}$: "My old mother lives alone in my country. I would like to invite her to Japan to live with me. Can I do that? What are the requirements for that?"

A: Unfortunately there is no visa category to be granted to your mother. She can visit you with a short-term visa.

Q: "My friend abroad is finishing her college education and wishes to come to Japan to work. How can I advise her for that?"

A: She may be eligible for a "Engineer/Specialist in Humanities/International Services" visa as long as she has signed a job contract with a public or private company in Japan.

NO NEED TO SUBMIT CHILD ALLOWANCE ANNUAL UPDATE

Last year, the government of Japan amended the law to discontinue the annual update which the beneficiaries of child allowance (児童 手当 Jido Teate) had been required to submit in June every year. Households bringing up children up to the end of junior high school now can continue to receive the allowance automatically, as a general rule. Only when the city cannot confirm the eligibility based on the public records, the city will send a form for confirmation to the household.
