WHAT CANNOT HAPPEN BEFORE MAY HAPPEN NOW Think about your disaster preparedness

September 1 is Disaster Prevention Day in Japan. The day was established to mark the Great Kanto Earthquake, which took place 100 years ago, on this day in 1923. We still have strong earthquakes measuring an upper 5 or more (on the Japanese seismic intensity scale of 7) across the country several times a year. Besides, with climate change, unprecedented rainfalls and unprecedented typhoons cause major damages that cannot be addressed by traditional disaster prevention and disaster reduction systems.

EARLY ACTIONS BASED ON PRECISE INFORMATION

While earthquakes are unpredictable, typhoons and heavy rainfalls can be forecast to some extent to minimize damages. When you hear a weather alert issued in Saitama, check local news at FM Chappy 77.7 MHz, through Iruma City's official LINE account and wireless communication system.

One of other good information sources is KIKIKURU, which is a real-time disaster map system on the website created by the Japan

Meteorological Agency. It shows risks of landslides and floods caused by heavy rain with easy-to-understand color-codes.

PREPARATION YOU CAN DO NOW

- Stock at least three days worth of food and drinking water, ideally seven days worth.
- Have enough stock of daily commodity such as toilet paper and your regular medicine.
- Prevent TV and furniture from falling.
- Have a simple toilet kit at home.
- Decide on how to make communication and where to evacuate within your family.
- Join the drill in your neighborhood.

HOME-START IRUMA VISITS AND HELPS FAMILIES WITH YOUNG CHILDREN

Sometimes families need a little help to get their children off to a good start. So this peer-support

system of UK origin called "Home-Start" matches experienced volunteers with families with young children (0-6 years old), to offer help and support for free.

A Home-Start volunteer will visit you in your own home, usually once a week, for a couple of hours. You decide what you will do together. They will help you with practical tasks, and emotional issues such as:

- Using local services or specialist support
- Getting involved with your local community.
- Encouraging play and reading with your children
- Listening to your worries, concerns and hopes for your family
- Sharing their own experiences of parenting

In Iruma, the system is operated by the Shakai Fukushi Kyogikai (Social Welfare Council). If you are interested, contact by phone or by Email.
