## IRUMA'S OWN FINANCIAL SUPPORT PROGRAMS FOR CHILD REARING FAMILIES

Utilizing the Regional Revitalization Temporary Subsidies from the National Government, the City of Iruma has been providing its own supporting programs for child-rearing households to reduce the burdens of rising utility bills and food prices.

### Free School Lunch Program for Elementary & Junior High School Children

Until the end of March, the school lunch expenses for all 9,000 elementary and junior high students in Iruma are paid by the city. For the families whose children cannot eat school lunch because of allergies or religious reasons and bring their lunch box to school, the city offers the amount equivalent to the school lunch fees. ### Subsidy for School Lunch Fees for 3 to 5 Year-old Children

Late February, the City sent a QUO card worth 15,000 yen to the families who were sending their 3 to 5 year-old children to a kindergarten or nursery school in Iruma as of January 1, 2024. This amount is the equivalent to the three-month school lunch fees. The card was sent by registered mail, which you need to receive in person. ### Nursery Fee Subsidy for 0 to 2 Year-old Babies

The City also paid 30,000 yen in late February to the bank account of the families who were sending their 0 to 2 year-old babies to nursery schools in Iruma as of January 1, 2024. This is to

# FREE COVID-19 VACCINATION AND MEDICAL SUBSIDIES TO END ON MARCH 31

According to the governmental policy to phase out COVID-19 financial supports, free COVID-19 vaccination is scheduled to end on March 31, 2024. After April 1, only elderly and other vulnerable citizens will have chance to receive COVID-19 vaccination once a year with a certain amount of grant. Other people have to pay 100% of its cost. If you wish to receive one before March 31 and have no coupon at hand, please request at COVID-19 Vaccine Navi page (https://v-sys.mhlw.go.jp/) (English & Chinese available).

Also, the special subsidies for medical treatments of COVID-19 will discontinue after April. As with other diseases, you will pay 30% of the expenses while 70% is covered by your health insurance. **Inquiries**: Chiiki Hoken-ka (Section for Community Health)

For Children in Elementary or Junior High School


The City subsidizes school expenses such as fees for school lunches, school trips and school supplies, for families in financial difficulty who have children in elementary or junior high school. Applications for the 2024 fiscal year are being accepted now at the Gakko Kyoiku-ka (School Education Section) in the City Office. Detailed leaflets are also available at schools in the City. Eligibility is based on the household income in the previous year and the amount of house rent. **Inquiries**: Gakko Kyoiku-ka (School Education Section)

### FILE YOUR FINAL TAX RETURN BY THE 15th OF THIS MONTH

Tax returns for the year 2023 should be filed by March 15 (Fri). You can do the filing procedure at the City Hall from Monday to Friday to March 15. Bring your Gensen Choshu-Hyo, and other supporting documents such as documents relating to dependents, a certificate of health insurance/life insurance premium payment, and so on.

There is a basic exemption for all ( $\pm$ 480,000) and an employment income deduction for salary earners (at least  $\pm$ 550,000), and so you may miss these deductions if you do not go through a yea-end

adjustment or file the final tax return form.

### SEIBU LINE TIMETABLE CHANGE ON MARCH 16





### **DOG REGISTRATION & VACCINATION**

In Japan, the law requires that all dogs 91 days and older should be registered and get a rabies shot every year between April and June. The City will offer vaccinations between April 6 and May 18 at a number of different locations throughout the City. Shots are 3,500 yen. A notice will be mailed to owners of registered dogs this month. Applications for new registration (valid for the life of the dog) will be accepted at these sites and costs 3,000 yen. You can also get your dog receive a shot (the price for shot may vary) and receive a certificate of vaccination (550 yen) at designated animal hospitals in the city. **Inquiries**: Seikatsu Kankyo-ka (Section for Living Environment)
