Much-awaited construction of the new city hall building will begin in mid-March. During

the construction period, city hall operations will continue as they are now, including the relevant counters. However, there will be restrictions on traffic flow to the city hall and parking lot, as well as restrictions on the available areas.

The construction will continue until the fiscal year 2029. For details, please see the city's official website.

>There is a limited number of spaces in the city hall parking lot. Please use the parking lot of the old citizen hall.

> The location of the community bus (Tea-Road) stop will change to the current Seibu bus stop.

FILE YOUR FINAL TAX RETURN BY THE 17th OF THIS MONTH



Tax returns for the year 2024 should be filed by March 17 (Mon). You can do the filing procedure at the City Hall from Monday to Friday to March 17. Bring your Gensen Choshu-Hyo, and other supporting documents such as documents relating to dependents, a certificate of health insurance/life insurance premium payment, and so on.

There is a basic exemption for all (\pm 480,000) and an employment income deduction for salary earners (at least \pm 550,000), and so you may miss these deductions if you do not go through a year-end adjustment or file the final tax return form.

The correct report of income is indispensable not only for tax payment, but also for your visa extension and availability of city's administrative services. Information Desk for Foreign Residents is happy to help you filing the return!

CHIKU CENTER IS CONVENIENT!

There are nine Chiku (District) Centers in Iruma City. These Centers function as branch offices of the City Hall. You can complete many procedures without coming to the City Hall, including move-in/out reports, registration of seal, eligibility for Child Allowance/Medical Subsidies, membership for National Health Insurance, issuance of certificates, etc.

The Centers are also used as venues for activities of local residents. They are available from 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. However, from April 2025, the centers will be closed at 5:15 p.m. when there is no reservation at night.

APPLY NOW FOR SUBSIDY FOR SCHOOL EXPENSES Especially for New Students in Elementary or Junior High School

The City subsidizes school expenses such as school lunch fees, school trip fees, and school supplies fees for families with financial difficulty that have children in elementary or junior high school. This subsidy is available through an application and review process, based on your family's income in the previous year.

From this school year on, applications can be made through e-form. For 1st grade students of elementary/junior high schools, a special subsidy for preparation expenses (approximately 50,000/60,000 yen respectively) will be provided when an application is made within April. To apply, you need to have completed your income report for the previous year. Prepare necessary documents (e.g. a copy of the contract of house rent, if applicable) and apply using the barcode on the right. DOG REGISTRATION & VACCINATION

In Japan, the law requires that all dogs 91 days and older should be registered and get a rabies shot every year between April and June. The City will offer vaccinations between April 15 and May 17 at a number of different locations throughout the City. Shots are 3,500 yen. A notice will be mailed to owners of registered dogs this month. Applications for new registration (valid for the life of the dog) will be accepted at these sites and cost 3,000 yen. **Inquiries**: Seikatsu Kankyo-ka (Section for Living Environment)
